 - Information exchange, learning and innovation network which facilitates the gathering, processing and dissemination of TFCA related information






















To overcome TFCA challenges through shared learning, knowledge management and collaboration














purpose

- Guided & led by a Steering Committee (SC) comprising TFCA Focal Points from all SADC MS + SADC Secretariat
- Chairing of SC will change as per SADC Troika
- Members: renew their membership every 2 years – otherwise auto-lapse




















1. Information exchange:

- Sharing experiences within and across TFCAs
- Conducting field visits to enhance understanding of local contexts

2. Joint learning and knowledge management:

- Developing a portal as a platform for joint learning, information exchange and knowledge management
- Developing a <u>regional</u> repository of TFCA related information
- Innovation and idea testing through joint experimentation and documentation
- Knowledge product development
- Enabling peer review and feedback

3. Resource mobilisation

4. Strengthening collaboration and relationships:

- Conducting face to face meetings
- Developing linkages with TFCA stakeholder groups
- Facilitating empowerment at the level of the TFCA















Main Characteristics:

- Over 200 members as registered through the online portal <u>www.tfcaportal.org</u>
- Representation from all SADC MS except Madagascar & Mauritius
- More than 50% of members from government/parastatal institutions (lead agencies for TFCA development)
- Other representation NGOs, ICPs, Academia, private sector (including consultants)
- No CBOs represented needs to be addressed



- 1. Understand the different models for collaborative management support being applied in PAs within SADC TFCAs (and elsewhere in Africa), including the design of these models;

- 3. Identify mechanisms to manage expectations of & benefits to the parties engaging in collaborative management support projects.
- 4. Determine if these models have mechanisms to measure their effectiveness & build resilience of these arrangements.
- 5. Determine the contribution of these arrangements to achieving national, regional & international obligations.
- 6. Highlight lessons learned & provide recommendations that can assist parties (government, communities, NGOs, private sector partners & ICPs) wishing to engage in collaborative management support projects
